Dear Windcrest Friends and Neighbors,

You will be happy to know that as of this date, our budget for the new fiscal year 2011/2012 is almost complete. The Council has had several meetings to review and modify the budget that was presented to us by the City Manager and the Director of Finance. It has been refreshing to have had questions and suggestions from our residents. Some of the discussions have been spirited, but it shows how serious and passionate this Council is with formulating the budget. Everyone on Council has spent countless hours reviewing and adding to the process. It is a pleasure to see such participation.

Last year at this time, your City Council set out to “fix the problems” of the past and not to ignore them. Thanks to these actions, we will enjoy a savings of over \$500,000 with the city operating within its means and in the black by over \$400,000!! That is quite an accomplishment in these difficult economic times.

During our current budget process, your council has continued to look forward for ways and means to improve our quality of life here in Windcrest. The Council has budgeted \$75,000 for Civic Center renovations, \$90,000 to repair alleys, and still we will have over \$300,000 additional funds for improvements to the residential area to include our parks. Additionally, the city has over \$500,000 available to work on our streets. Our citizens need to know that our city is in very good financial shape. We are the envy of many other communities in the area. Your Council recognizes that now is the time to re-invest in our residential areas. It has been neglected, and I promise that the positive changes you have seen recently will continue at an even grander scale.

You can look forward to continued police attention given to speeders and other law violators, especially in our residential areas. Our warrant round up was not only a success financially, but it also sent the message that if you speed or break the law in Windcrest and get a ticket; you will have to pay or go to jail. This will help to deter these types of activities. The Council is working with Police Chief Pabon to make sure any reasonable needs he has with regard to stopping the speeders will be met.

We continue to look for ways and means for our court to run more effectively and efficiently. Of particular importance, we want to seize on opportunities to help us collect long neglected and past due warrants. We are also planning another warrant round up for the fall, instituting a pay online system and participating with scofflaw program. Many great things are happening and I am always open and available to discuss any matter with a citizen.

Thank you for all the compliments on the “new” Newsletter. Remember, all it took was to ask our publisher for a better product and a great effort by the citizen Newsletter committee. It hasn't cost the city a penny extra!!!!

Hello, fellow Citizens of Windcrest, I hope everyone is doing well and enjoying these wonderful "HOT" summer days.

In the Month of July 2011, we continued *our everlasting journey on improving our overall "Customer Service" and gratitude towards the community.* During the month of July 2011, the city staff invested well over 20 hours in City Council meetings discussing the FY 2011-2012 budget financial numbers. The overall synopsis is the City of Windcrest is "financially sound":

- ❖ a growing "General Undesignated Fund" balance already exceeding over 4.2 months of operation
- ❖ over \$500,000 dollars restricted for street repairs
- ❖ approximately \$100,000 from the hotel/motel tax ("HOT tax") restricted for Civic Center and recreational facility repairs
- ❖ approximately \$175,000 restricted funds from the WCCPD, solely for police public safety

Here are a few projects/items that we all continue to work on and will continue to be items of importance as we continue to make the City of Windcrest a better place to live .

- ❖ We met and invited Raba-Kistner Consultants, Inc. to come give the Mayor and City Council a presentation. Re: *Facility condition assessment, maintenance, and repair/capital improvement programming.* This type of program will assist the Mayor and City Council to prioritize all capital improvements needed within the community." **"Work in Progress"**

- ❖ External audits "**Work in Progress**" on the following
 - CPS Electric provider by Tristem, Ltd.
 - Telephone Communications by CACC, INC.
 - *HOT Tax* by Resource Professionals Group
- ❖ We are "**pending on moving forward**" with the Law firm of Brown & Ortiz, P.C. on finalizing the agreement related to the previous work that was approximately 85% complete related to *planning and zoning codes* that will benefit the City of Windcrest. This project will require full participation by the Planning and Zoning Board, EDC, and community participation during upcoming meeting, before the City Council considers approving the final product.

Once again, please remember that our doors are always open at City Hall; you are always welcomed to come over and visit us.

COUCH TO 5K RUNNING/(AND OR) WALKING PLAN (abbreviated C25K)

Under our banner of Quality of Life and Community Activities, I have volunteered to organize a 5K Run/(and or) Walk for this November. It is still in the planning stage so I have few details. Stay tuned to future Newsletters. This community activity is directed to everyone in Windcrest who wishes to improve his/her endurance, stamina, and cardio-respiratory health, no matter what level. And you may (if you watch your calories) lose a few pounds in the process. A One-Mile Fun Run/Walk will be included in this activity for seniors, children, dog-walkers and wheel chair-bound residents (with or without assistance).

To achieve this goal it is important for first-time runners/walkers to gradually condition their bodies. To this effort, the Walzem YMCA is helping us by providing a **Couch to 5K Running/(and or) Walking Program**. The program is less of a running regimen than a walking and jogging program beginning with lots of walking and very short periods of jogging – progressing to more jogging and less walking, depending on your body's ability. As always, it is highly suggested that you check with your doctor before starting any exercise program. The program requires a commitment of 3 days of training per week for the 8-Week Program. A weekly session will be held every Saturday at 8:30am beginning on September 10 at the Windcrest Golf Course. Each session should take about 20 to 30 minutes. The remaining 2 weekly sessions can be organized or on-your-own. There is no fee involved in this training. Proof of residency in Windcrest (i.e. Driver's License, Utility Bills, etc.) will be required before disposing of hazardous waste.

Windcrest 2011 Fall Clean-Up

October 3rd through October 7th is scheduled for the annual curbside Fall Clean Up. Curbside pickup of brush, tree trimmings & large items will be provided. Please do not place items under overhanging branches or under trees as the (Allied Waste) crane will not be able to pick them up. Brush & tree trimmings must be in piles. You must have items along your curbside by 7:00 a.m. on Monday, October 3rd to insure that items are picked up. Examples of large items (hot water heaters, bicycles, lawn mowers, barbecue pits, etc.). No concrete, bricks or rocks.



The Flag On Windway

Historically, the predominant presence of military-oriented citizens in Windcrest provided a natural tendency to "fly the flag" daily. Since Windway Drive was one of the gateways to the city, its residents had collaborated in the early 1970's to be especially attentive to getting their individual flags in the air on holidays.

During a street party in October 1982, Alice Riggs suggested an effort be made to erect a flagpole on the island on Windway; the idea received broad encouragement. Her husband, retired AF Colonel Bill Riggs (now deceased) and retired AF Colonel John Whiting were appointed to develop the idea. Bill contacted a flag company and relayed to John that a 25-foot pole could be installed for \$375 if they could muster the funds. John advised him to order it and he (John) would pay for it. They could then advise their fellow-residents and assess a pro rate share. Several days later the project was completed, the flag was flying and the assessments flowed in satisfactorily.

For the next several years, flag duty was shared by several of the residents on a weekly schedule. At one point, a request was made to the City to provide electric power to the island so the flag could fly 24/7, but the funding was not available. Later, the City found it advisable to install a sprinkler system on the island, which provided the opportunity to tap in for the flagpole light.

At that point, the residents opted to donate the flagpole to the City and an appropriate dedication ceremony took place with Council representation. The flag now flies 24/7.

This is but another example of the interest and positive action Windcrest citizens have shown over the years in community spirit and productive development of the City.

The following ordinance passed on the second reading during the July 6, 2011 City Council Meeting.

- Ordinance No. 2011-646 (O), approving and adopting an amendment to the budget for operating the municipal government of the City of Windcrest for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2010 and ending on September 30, 2011; and establishing a savings clause and an effective date.

The following resolutions were approved during the July 6, 2011 and July 18, 2011 City Council meetings.

- Resolution No. 2011-348 (R), approving an agreement with Brown & Ortiz, P.C., Attorneys at Law to update the zoning codes and implementation of the previously created master plan for the City of Windcrest.
- Resolution No. 2011-349 (R), authorizing an agreement with Raba-Kistner Consultants, Inc. to develop a multi-year capital investment program for the preservation of real property assets of the City of Windcrest.


Second Windcrest Warrant Round Up To Be Held in September

September 27th and 28th will be the SECOND Windcrest Warrant Round Up. The first warrant round up allowed the court to clear warrants that would still be sitting in our files. Not only did it help in clearing warrants but as a result the court has seen an increase in people coming in to resolve their citations and payments before it gets to the warrant status. Unfortunately, due to our economic situation some people find it hard coming up with money to pay their citations and others just don't care.

Since this is the case, warrants will always be an issue in the court. The court plans on diligently staying on top of this matter. Warrant round ups are planned every three months.

Nigerian advance-fee fraud has been around for decades, but now seems to have reached epidemic proportions: Some consumers have told the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) they are receiving dozens of offers a day from supposed Nigerians politely promising big profits in exchange for help moving large sums of money out of their country. And apparently, many compassionate consumers are continuing to fall for the convincing sob stories, the unfailingly polite language, and the unequivocal promises of money. These advance-fee solicitations are scams. And according to the FTC, the scam artists are playing each and every consumer for a fool. Here's the play book: Claiming to be Nigerian officials, businesspeople or the surviving spouses of former government honchos, con artists offer to transfer millions of dollars into your bank account in exchange for a small fee. If you respond to the initial offer, you may receive "official looking" documents. Typically, you're then asked to provide blank letterhead and your bank account numbers, as well as some money to cover transaction and transfer costs and attorney's fees.

If you're tempted to respond to an offer, the FTC suggests you

stop and ask yourself two important questions: Why would a perfect stranger pick you to share a fortune with, and why would you share your personal or business information, including your bank account numbers or your company letterhead, with someone you don't know? And the U.S. Department of State cautions against traveling to the destination mentioned in the letters. According to State Department reports, people who have responded to these "advance-fee" solicitations have been beaten, subjected to threats and extortion, and in some cases, murdered.

If you receive an offer via email from someone claiming to need your help getting money out of Nigeria - or any other country, for that matter - forward it to the FTC at spam@uce.gov.

If you have lost money to one of these schemes, call your local Secret Service field office. Local field offices are listed in the Blue Pages of your telephone directory.

WINDCREST TELEPHONE DIRECTORY: If you would like to be listed in the Windcrest City Directory, please make sure we have your current telephone number. Some of you are probably wondering what the Water District has to do with the Windcrest Directory. The answer is that the Windcrest American Legion Post 612 publishes a new directory periodically. One of their sources for names, addresses, and phone numbers is the District. Everyone who moves into Old Windcrest (north of Walzem Road), has to set up service with us, so we usually have the most current list of phone numbers. We do not release information on anyone who has requested confidentiality.

WATERING RESTRICTION: At the time this is being written, we remain in Stage II watering restrictions. If we go into Stage III, we will send you a notice of the change. The biggest change will be a reduction in the morning watering hours from 3:00 am to **8:00 am** to 3:00 am to **7:00 am**.

In Stage II, you can water between 3:00 am and 8:00 am and 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm on "your" day. If we go into Stage III, the hours are reduced to 3:00 am to 7:00 am and 8:00 pm to 10:00 pm on your day. Hand watering is permitted any day (including Saturday and Sunday) as long as you do it within the hours associated with each stage (see above). You can use drip irrigation to water a vegetable garden and around your foundation any time. In Stage II you can wash your cars, trucks, boats, etc. at home on your watering day. In Stage III, you have to take them to your local

commercial car wash. In Stage II, you can add water to pools, spas, and hot tubs to restore them to maintenance levels. In Stage III, refilling of an empty pool or filling of a new pool is prohibited.



Creature Feature: Red-tailed Hawk



Our city is filled with interesting and beneficial animal life.

The Red-tailed hawk weighs between 1.5 and 3.5 pounds, stands up to 2.2' tall and has a wingspan up to 5' across. Overhead they are recognized by their cream colored underside laced with black or brown. The females average 25% bigger and heavier than the males. They are monogamous and have 1-3 chicks in late spring. Over the next 12-13 weeks the chicks grow, learn to fly and learn to hunt. Right now it is common to see 2-5 Red-tails overhead with the chicks vocalizing the infamous cry of the hawk. Mom and dad with their 1-3 fledglings are teaching them the art of flying and hunting. You will see wonderful displays of soaring and diving as the young hone their skills and vocalize among the family unit.

The preferred diet is small mammals: squirrel, rat, mouse and occasionally small domestic creatures up to more than double their weight but they will also eat bats, snakes, birds and insects. They will not feed on carrion. It is not true they will attack only what they can carry in flight. If their meal cannot be carried into a tree, they will feast on the ground and carry off what they can later.




