Saturday, December 12th: This is the Light-Up Party/Ceremony at City Hall, and the first official day of Light-Up. It is open to the public and free at City Hall. You do not want to miss this night of fun. This year the Light -Up Ceremony will be the biggest and best ever! It is from 6 – 9 PM at City Hall.

December 12 – 31st: This is when people from all over come to see our beautiful city. We are internationally recognized for our lights. Last year, the Firefighters passed out over 10,000 maps and asked for donations. They brought in over \$30,000 for the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department. The first day the maps will be available will be at the Light-Up Ceremony December 12th at City Hall. Come get a map and see where the winners are located. Tour the city and enjoy the Holiday Season.

Thursday, January 10, 2016: This is the Awards Ceremony for the Light-Up winners. It is open to all Windcrest citizens to come and applaud the winners. It is a free event and will be at Takas Park Civic Center. It starts at 7 PM. All the winners will be receiving professional photographs of their house, a beautiful plaque and a cash award. The Grand Prize winner will receive a special plaque that will be made in duplicate. This plaque will be displayed at City Hall in perpetuity. A new tradition this administration started four years ago. We have the Light-Up Wall of Fame. There is entertainment, and free food and drinks (non-alcoholic) while supplies last. More information about this celebration will be in the January Newsletter. Please mark your calendars for this special day.

Garage Sale Location for Charitable/Civic Organizations Based in Windcrest (re-cap): Overall, we believe this event was a success; however, the weather did not cooperate with us. Several charities took advantage of the City Hall parking lot to sell items and take donations. Hopefully, this will be continued in future Garage Sale Weekends. There will be another City Wide Garage Sale in the spring. These dates will be announced soon.

Windcrest Gift Store – OPEN: One of my goals was to open a gift shop where people can purchase items branded with the Windcrest logo, as well as our flags. Well, it has finally opened. It is located next to the Post Office at City Hall. Please come by and check it out. We will add inventory slowly. It is a great pace to do some Christmas shopping. I promise you will get compliments when people see Windcrest on your chest or hat. We are – “The City of Lights.” I am hopeful that Council will agree that any profits will go towards the various charities based in Windcrest.

Park Renovations: You may have noticed that the much anticipated renovations of the Autumn Sunset Park and the Duck Pond are underway. Presently, new sidewalks are being constructed, drainage concerns are being addressed and new fixtures will be added (benches, trash containers and lights). Once complete, this area will closely mirror the Takas Park Pond. It will look terrific, and will really add value to these great amenities. Pardon our dust! We believe it will be worth the inconvenience. A huge thank you goes out to our Parks and Rec Commission.

Economic Development: There are many things happening. We have Public Hearings scheduled for various areas. There are plans for more building on Eisenhower Road and Midcrown (the annexed area) for more mixed industrial space. Eastpoint Group has received positive feedback with regards to the industrial building space currently under construction that they are developing. Thus, they are expanding their efforts. Behind the IN-N-Out Burger will be a Holiday Inn Express Hotel. The developers are asking for a re-plot to accommodate the added parking spaces needed for the development of this hotel. Additionally, there is a hearing for a re-plot of the lot where the former Pear Tree Inn stood. It has almost been completely demolished. A restaurant will be taking the place of this lot. Again, the hearing is to re-plot to address parking issues. There is so much more coming to fruition. Stay tuned for more updates in future Newsletters.

Volunteering and Participating: We need more people on the Newsletter Committee, Windcrest Citizens’ Patrol and Animal Task Force. Please call Kelly Hamilton at City Hall if you wish to volunteer. Remember that there are still places of service within the City. If you want to participate or volunteer in any area of the City, you won’t be turned away. FREE TRAINING! CERT is about disaster readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety, and doing the greatest good for the greatest number in the shortest amount of time. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens will be initially on their own and their actions can make a difference. Through training, citizens can manage utilities and put out small fires; treat the three killers by opening airways, controlling bleeding, and treating for shock; provide basic medical aid; search for and rescue victims safely; and organize themselves and spontaneous volunteers to be effective.

There are many jobs within CERT for someone who wants to be involved and help. Following a disaster, CERT members also needed for documentation, comforting others, logistics, communication skills through HAM Radio, use of the Incident Command System etc. Non-disaster related team activities may include keeping databases, developing a website, writing a newsletter, planning activities, helping with special events and organizing exercises and activities.

If interested in this training, the next CERT training will be held at the Windcrest Civic Center from Friday, Feb. 19th 6:00 to 10:00, Saturday, Feb. 20th 8:30 to 4:30 and Sunday, Feb. 21st 8:30 to 3:30. CODE ENFORCEMENT UNIT

The Christmas Season is upon us and as you know our city is nationally famous for its Christmas lights. With this in mind, please check your properties and make sure trailers, inoperable vehicles and general rubbish are removed from view or disposed of properly. Hundreds, if not thousands of vehicles will be traveling on our streets and through our neighborhoods, so please keep as many vehicles off the street as possible during Christmas light viewing hours. You will need to plan ahead for trips to work, stores or just to get in and out of the city. Keep your properties secured during the heightened activity and if you have any low hanging branches or bushes over the street and side walks. Take a few minutes to trim them up and away from these areas if needed.



If you have any junk metal that needs to be removed or maybe a vehicle you want to get rid of, check with the local charities and donate these items. This will also help clean your property and provide you with a charitable tax deduction. Remember, this is also the season when leaves fall. You can blow your leaves to the street; however, you must pick them up. Do not litter please!

You are sitting in traffic waiting to make a right turn. You look over and there is a parking lot that accesses the road you are wanting to turn on. It would be so easy to cut across that parking lot to avoid all that traffic!!! Can you do it? The law says NO! Chapter 545 of the Texas Transportation Code Subchapter 1 545.423 says (a) An operator may not cross a sidewalk or drive through a driveway, parking lot, or business or residential entrance without stopping the vehicle and (b) An operator may not cross or drive in or on a sidewalk, driveway, parking lot, or business or residential entrance at an intersection to turn right or left from one highway to another highway.



Preparing Your Pets for the Winter Weather!

Do not leave pets outdoors when the temperature drops this winter season. While outside for walks or when let outside to relieve themselves, short-haired dogs may feel more comfortable wearing a sweater. No matter what the temperature is, the wind chill factor can threaten a pet's life. Pets are sensitive to severe cold weather and are at risk for frostbite and hypothermia during extreme cold snaps. Exposed skin on noses, ears and paw pads can quickly freeze and suffer permanent damage.

Pets that spend a lot of time outdoors need more food in the winter because cold weather and the effort to stay warm depletes energy. Routinely check your pet's water dish to make certain the water is fresh and not frozen. Use plastic food and water bowls at all times when the temperature is low, your pet's tongue can stick and freeze to metal.

Also remember that Antifreeze is a deadly poison and is extremely harmful to people and animals. It has a sweet taste and may attract animals. Wipe up spills and keep antifreeze and all household chemicals, locked up and out of reach. Coolants and antifreeze made with propylene glycol are less toxic to pets, wildlife and family. Have a safe winter season and don't forget to take special care of your pets.
