The WVFD passed out maps and asked for donations in exchange for the maps throughout the Holiday Season. They also included other organizations to share in the fun. We also need to say thanks to the many sponsors of the maps. Frost Bank came back this year as the title sponsor of the maps. Please review the map. These sponsors are too numerous to mention in this article, but are critically important in helping raise much needed funds for our Volunteer Fire Department and also helping to underwrite many of the costs of the Light-Up events. Light-Up Ceremony (Re-cap): This year it was on Saturday, December 10th at City Hall. The longer term residents have seen this event grow from a hundred or so people to an event that draws thousands. Thank you to Windcrest Residents Mr. and Mrs. Flinn for "calling" Santa and Mrs. Claus and having them attend this year. That is the highlight of the evening. The biggest thanks goes out to the Newsletter Committee. These volunteers came out early, helped set up and braved the conditions until the end. They are a huge reason we have success with all of our events. They are an invaluable committee and cannot be thanked enough. THANKS!!

Windcrest Women's Club: Citizens, we all owe many thank yous to the Windcrest Women's Club. They do so much for our community with regard to

Light-Up. They have been the main sponsor from day one – over fifty years. Many people do not realize how much work goes into this event. Arguably, the most important aspect is the judging. Whereas sometimes we do not agree with the results, let me state that all the voting is done using volunteers from outside the city. The Women's Club strives to make this process unbiased and keep the integrity of the results at the top of the list. Many hours are spent with this process. Economic Development: To recap some of the latest great news – more Economic Development has been approved in the annexed area of Windcrest. This is the land south of Walzem Road. More Light Industrial Warehouse space will be added. If you have a chance, please go down Eisenhower and view all the construction. Additionally, the new Whataburger was scheduled to break ground during the Holiday Season, as well as Urban Air which is located in the mall next to Office Depot. This is an incredible action park. Please go by and check it out. Construction is well underway on the Holiday Inn Express which is behind the IN-N-OUT Burger and Pollo Tropical. There are also plans for a Wash Tub Car Wash to be built next to this hotel. As you can see, there are quite a few exciting new amenities for our residents and businesses that will be bringing in hundreds of thousands of new sales tax revenue into our city! Thanks WEDC volunteers and staff. We are poised to have a great 2017!

Street Repairs: The Council passed to approve the bid for the next phase of street repairs. Thus, this Phase will begin in the Spring. We did not want to interrupt Light-Up, so we suspended work until after the Holiday Season. Rest assured, this administration is committed to continuing to improve our infrastructure and amenities. As you know, we are systematically improving all the streets in Windcrest over the next several years. This is a very important Committee.

Parks and Rec: This administration is already off and running with projects. At the present time, along with the Parks and Rec Committee, we are going out to bid and researching costs to redo the tennis courts and basketball courts at Takas Park. Also, we are looking at replacing the temporary bathroom located at Takas Park with a permanent one. Also, the feasibility of adding a beach volleyball court(s) is underway. We are working with the Windcrest Little League to do improvements to the fields and the structures. Additionally, we are researching and doing our due diligence with regards to building a Senior Citizen Community Center for Windcrest. There will be a lot happening in the first quarter of this year, so stay tuned. If you want to help – please give me a call at **210-846-5507** (cell). I would love to hear from you. 

Pets, such as dogs, can be a serious problem for both the owner and dog if not properly contained. If your dog is running loose, they are in danger of being hit by a car, being injured in a fight with another dog, or being hurt in a number of other ways. Additionally, you are liable for any damage or injury your dog may cause and you may be required to pay a fine if they are picked up by the Windcrest Police Department Animal Care & Control Unit or another animal control agency. In order to resolve this problem, you must determine not only how your dog is getting out, but also why they are eluding.

- Walk your dog daily... It's great exercise
- Teach your dog to fetch a ball or Frisbee and practice with them as often as possible.
- Teach your dog a few commands and/or tricks
- Take an obedience class.
- Use toys filled with treats, to keep your dog busy when you're not home.
- Keep your dog inside when you're unable to supervise them.
- An intact male or female dog is motivated by a strong natural drive to seek out other dogs. It can be very difficult to prevent an intact dog from escaping because their motivation to do so is very high. Be a responsible pet owner!
- Have your male dog neutered.
- Have your female dog spayed




