Windcrest Economic Development Update -Tim Maloney: Long time EDC President Tim Maloney recently had to step down. He had given this administration, and this city, a one year commitment many years ago. He stayed on for over six years! Words cannot adequately describe all he did for our great city. Take a moment and ask someone on Council or the EDC and I am confident they will say what an extraordinary job he did, and how he is an even greater person. In last month's Newsletter I wrote that we were working to finalize the 2017-2018 budget.

The majority of concerns and issues that I have received from our residents are about the condition of our streets. I have recommended an ordinance that would give our citizens an opportunity to vote on a Bond that would address major street repairs. For example a \$5 Million Bond could accomplish the needed work on Midcrown and Eaglecrest plus 15-18 miles of additional streets here in Windcrest. I have been informed that all of this could be accomplished in one year. Of course, all of this would come at a cost. The estimates that I have received are an extra \$100-\$190 annually on your Home's tax for the duration of the Bond. I believe we must INVEST to ATTRACT the new home buyers and economic growth that keep Windcrest moving ahead. I also believe that it is very important that all of us should have the opportunity to vote whether we move forward with such an action or not.






We are lucky to have two hotels in our Windcrest community – Drury Inn and Holiday Inn Express. Both hotels have recently made some major progress! As mentioned in last month’s newsletter, the Drury Inn was just completely renovated. The lobby, dining area, rooms, and fitness center were totally flipped and they look wonderful. Hopefully by the time you are reading this the exterior updates will be finished as well. Curt Greer, Drury Inn’s Regional Manager, commented, “Drury Hotels are proud to be part of your Windcrest community for over 25 years now. Our family owned and operated hotel company has recently totally renovated all of our 89 guest rooms, public space and completing the exterior of our Drury Inn and Suites Northeast to exceed current trends and expectations. We look forward to many more years in the future.” There will be a ribbon cutting/grand opening ceremony for the new and improved Drury Inn in the near future. Details will be posted at a later date so stay tuned. We hope to see you there!

The Holiday Inn Express is not complete or open for business yet, but it is definitely on the right track. BJ Patel, Baywood Hotels’ VP of Development and Finance, estimated opening mid-late October and commented, “We are

progressing swiftly ahead with our hotel development in Windcrest and have not run into any project delays. Our experience with this project has been refreshingly easy and we can’t wait to open to serve this sector of the City,” when asked about the hotel’s progress. We are anxiously waiting to welcome our second hotel to the Windcrest community! Grand opening and ribbon cutting information will be released when the project is completed, sometime around October or November. Speaking of construction, the Eisenhower Rd. development is also coming along in a timely manner. There was recently a connection road built connecting Galahad to Eisenhower Rd., right off of I35. The road is near completion and will, hopefully by the time you are reading this article, be open to the public. The City is also planning on having a ribbon cutting ceremony for this road to officially open it to traffic. If you haven’t seen it, check out the photos below or drive by today! It is definitely going to be a very useful and popular road.

Development further down Eisenhower Rd. is continuing and advancing as well. US Auto Force has moved into Building 3 of Tract 5, right across the street from Stanley Steemer, occupying nearly 90,000 sf. US Auto Force opened their doors for business on Monday, August 7 and we couldn’t be happier to have them here! Once they’re settled in a bit, we will be planning a grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony for them as well. Stay tuned for more information coming soon!



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Bexar County WCID

This is an update on what is happening at Bexar County WCID #10.

There are many important things happening at our Water District that are important for our customers to be informed about and to understand. However, to understand what is happening today at the Water District, it is necessary for citizens to understand actions taken by all Water Boards since August 2014.

In October 2014, the Water Board purchased property at 5507 Randolph Road with the stated purpose of building an administrative building and maintenance facility. No records exist that any formal due diligence was performed prior to purchasing the land nor that any needs assessment was performed to determine if these facilities were needed. In November 2014, three new board members were elected. Some of the new members questioned the necessity of these facilities especially moving the administrative office out of Windcrest. The City had previously offered additional space at City Hall, but the offer was not accepted. In 2016 the Mayor gave up his office in City Hall to ensure that the Water District office had adequate space. This offer was accepted and 220 square feet were added. Therefore, no new office building was needed.

At that point, a majority of the Water Board in charge from November 2014-November 2016 decided to build a maintenance facility on the Randolph Road property. Again, some of the newly elected members asked if that was a necessary expense. The previous District Engineer repeated many times that the District had only 400 square feet of maintenance facility at the Windcrest Maintenance Area on Jim Seal. The previous engineer further stated numerous times that no land was available in the Windcrest Maintenance area on which to build additional maintenance space. At that point, money was already being spent for engineering, architects, re-platting, legal fees, etc. having to do with building on the Randolph property. At the October 2016 Board meeting a contractor was selected to build a 4000 square foot maintenance facility.

After the November 2016 Water Board election and the addition of two new Board members, more scrutiny and more investigation were launched into the necessity of building a new maintenance facility. This investigation revealed that the Water District had 1955 (967 sq. ft. inside and 988 sq. ft. of covered outdoor space) square feet of space at the Windcrest Maintenance Area some of which was loaned to other city entities (e.g. fire department, city maintenance, etc.). In June 2017 when the Water District requested that all other entities move from the District's space, they graciously complied. Therefore, the District had adequate space for maintenance, and there was no need to build a maintenance facility.

The District had already spent \$132,388.07 on the aforementioned engineering, architecture services, legal fees, etc. Those funds are not recoupable. In 2017 the current Board by a 3-2 decision cancelled the contract that had already been entered into by the previous Board to build a maintenance facility on the Randolph property. The cost to cancel that contract is included in the \$132,388. However, the District saved at least \$528,615 by cancelling the contract to build the maintenance facility which was not needed. Further, the current Board declared the Randolph property surplus, and it is currently for sale. Whatever the District receives from the sales of the Randolph property will be an additional savings to the \$528,615 the Board saved the District by cancelling the contract.

This savings is critically important. Why? The current Board hired a new Engineer and directed him to work with the General Manager to create a Capital Improvements Plan (CIP). The CIP assessed the current needs for repair and replacement in the water distribution system, sewer collection system and electrical system at the water production wells. Facts taken into account for the water and sewer systems for this assessment were: current condition (number of breaks, number of repairs, pressure issues, sewer overflows); age of infrastructure; materials used and useful life of those materials for both sewer and water lines; and soil conditions. There are no formal records of a CIP having formally been done by the District in the past. Factors taken into account for the electrical systems were: need for emergency backup power; need to replace aged equipment; meeting safety requirements; and meeting regulatory requirements.

Based on the information gathered some of the important facts are: **water distribution system** has 32.5 miles of pipe; only 11 miles have ever been replaced; 20.5 miles of the system were constructed prior to 1970; 65% of the system is over 40 years old; life expectancy of materials used is 40 years; soil conditions affect the number of breaks.

Sewer System has 27 miles of pipe; from 1970-2017 8.5 miles of the system were replaced or added; 18.5 miles of the system were constructed prior to 1970; 75% of the system is over 40 years old; materials used PVC and clay; life expectancy of these materials is 40 years; soil movement is affecting the pipe; televised reports done in 2009 showed that the existing lines were mostly of clay and were in poor condition in 2009---8 years ago.

Electrical Systems at Well Pumping Sites: The District has 4 production well sites. All well sites are currently powered through CPS energy utility only and do not have an alternate power source. All well sites' service gear, pump starter panels, transformers and other distribution electrical gear are more than 20 years old and have reached the recommended service life of the equipment. One well is in code violation of today's standards since it does not have a service rated disconnect or surge protection. The electrical racks at each well site have signs of corrosion. The 4 sites do not have adequate exterior lighting. Two sites' power panels are reaching their 20 year service life.

The cost of all CIP repairs is \$12,977,260.38 (design, survey, management and testing, and 10% contingency). Just as with home maintenance after years of ignoring repairs and replacements as they come up, the cost to take care of repairs and replacements can be large when they must be done. The money we saved by stopping the building on Randolph Road will be applied toward these repairs.

Financing these needed repairs and replacements will be explored by the Board. This is a large sum, but it is a "doable" thing. I want each customer to be reassured that the Water Board is committed to making these repairs and replacements as quickly and economically as possible. Our engineer assures us that we can do these in phases over 5-10 years and still ensure that our customers have dependable service and safe drinking water.



Failure to Identify

Did you know that according to the Texas Penal Code 38.02 a person commits an offense if he intentionally refuses to give his name, residence address, or date of birth to a peace officer who has lawfully arrested the person and requested the information, (b) A person commits an offense if he intentionally gives a false or fictitious name, residence address, or date of birth to a peace officer who has: (1) lawfully arrested the person; (2) lawfully detained the person; or (3) requested the information from a person that the peace officer has good cause to believe is a witness to a criminal offense.



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

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
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Curb Side Brush Pickup Map

- B. Residents in Section 2 should have articles to be picked up in place no later than Sunday, September 24th for pickup between September 25-29.
- C. Residents in Section 1 should have articles to be picked up in place no later than Sunday, October 1st for pickup between October 2-6.

- Other herbaceous and woody plants
- BBQ grills (without compressed gas tanks)
- Carpeting
- Fencing
- Furniture

****Refrigerators, freezers, and a/c window units will be collected only if refrigerant has been removed and the appliance is tagged and certified, indicating removal of refrigerant***.*

Materials Not Accepted

- Compressed Gas Tanks
- Tires
- Televisions
- Computers
- Medical Waste
- Appliances with refrigerant that has not been removed and certified.

Brush/Bulky Guidelines:

- Limit your brush pile to three (3) cubic yards.
- Brush must be placed within eight (8) feet of the curb.
- Do not place brush piles in front of parked cars, near fences, trees, mailboxes, beneath overhead wires, low-hanging tree limbs, or on top of gas/water meters.
- **Brush must be set out no later than 7:00 a.m. on the first day of your scheduled collection week.**
- Do not place material at the curb after crews have passed by your house.
