

Code Compliance & Enforcement

Wishing everyone a happy, healthy New Year! May your right hand always be stretched out in friendship, and always reach out to help a neighbor. Remember to prepare a plan for the next brush pick-up. The residential area pickup is divided by sections and an assigned week. Please check your correct assigned dates to put out your brush. You may put out your brush pick-up **no earlier than two days prior** to your assigned brush pick up dates. Don’t forget to include your alley clean-up!

Sec. 28-117. - Accumulating and disposing of garbage and brush prohibited in alleys. No person may store any brush or garbage in an alley, or areas immediately adjacent to alleys, or drains. Any garbage and brush set out for removal must be containerized.



The Gray Fox in Windcrest

Central Texas is home to the gray fox, usually between 8 and 12 pounds, which is smaller than some well-fed domestic cats, and moves quite gracefully, much like a cross between a cat and a dog. It is true that to see a fox in a place where people live is strange. No one should ever try to pet or corner a fox in order to catch it with their bare hands as they will perceive that as a threat.



Generally, foxes are not especially dangerous to humans or large pets. Foxes pose little danger to cats. But, like any other canine, foxes will chase cats. Although when faced with the claws and teeth of a cat, foxes will back away, knowing they will probably suffer a serious injury in any fight. Foxes eat rats and other rodents and can help to keep those pests down. Food sources include fruits, grains and vegetable matter as well as insects, voles, field mice, and shrews.





The gray fox is unique in that it can climb trees as deftly as a cat. In fact, the gray fox has been observed denning with young in the hollow of a tree, although many prefer rock crevices, underground burrows, hollow logs and even a good, undisturbed brush pile.

The kits reach their adult weight at five to six months and discover Momma is suddenly snarly and mean, chasing them away to find their own territories. Although it seems cruel, this is nature's way of preserving the next generation through geographical diversity.

Incidentally, the female also snubs the male when the kits are self-sufficient, but the same pair quite often unites forces again in December to start a new family; the gray fox is monogamous. Around December in Texas, the female marks the area with a scent indicating she's ready to become a team and breeding continues until March. If you live in the Hill Country, you may hear foxes calling to each other on crisp winter evenings (they seem to prefer clear, cold weather for that activity), which is a really good reason to live in this area.

Between three and six kits are born in April or May after a gestation period of about 53 days. Born blind and helpless, the kits quickly grow and leave the home nest seeking shelter in rock piles, brush, or in other sites that offer concealment and protection. Momma feeds and grooms them until they can move well, then hunts small game and brings it back to the den for the practice of hunting skills.





Weather Safety

As we start to get into the colder months, I wanted to take a moment and remind you about some safety practices to keep your family and your home safe.

Dress appropriately for the weather – ensuring the weather does not get the best of you, be sure you are wearing the clothing that is most appropriate for the weather. There are several apps available on your smart phone as well as countless other resources to ensure you know what the weather is going to be like. If you are traveling, be sure to check the weather at your destination, and pack the appropriate clothes!

Plan your trips ahead of time and pick the safest route – as we see an increase in traveling for the holiday season, be sure you check the road conditions and weather on your route to avoid getting stuck in bad weather!

DO NOT PLUG SPACE HEATERS INTO SURGE PROTECTORS – surge protectors are not capable of handling the electrical load that space heaters place on them. **Space heaters need to be plugged directly into the wall and they need to have 10 feet of clearance on all sides to ensure they do not catch anything on fire.** Also be sure you only plug one space heater into the wall at a time!

This is not a comprehensive list by any stretch of the imagination. However, we do post safety facts on our Facebook page regularly. Our number one goal is to keep you and your family safe and we want to do whatever we can to make that happen! If you have any questions, our office is always open and we have people here ready and willing to assist.

A Message from Fire Marshal Tim Zelenak

Hope everyone had a safe and wonderful Christmas. As we start a New Year, I would like to share some winter safety information with everyone. The months of January and February are typically the coldest months here in South Texas. Everyone wants a warm and cozy home when it's cold outside.

Safety Tips:

- Have your homes HVAC units inspected annually by a licensed HVAC Company.
- If your home furnace burns natural gas make sure you have a working carbon monoxide detector in your home.
- If you use space heaters in your home, make sure they are at least 4 feet away from anything that might catch fire. Don't plug your space heater into a power strip, this could overload your power strip and cause a fire. Make sure your space heater has a tip control on it; this shuts the unit off if it's knocked over.

Strong Leadership at the WEDC

Here is your reminder that we are having pet immunization and registration clinics on Saturday, January 18, 2020, from 9 a.m. – 11 a.m. and again on Saturday, February 15, 2020, from 9 a.m. – 11 a.m. in the City Hall parking lot. This will allow residents to get their pets’ vaccinations up to date and then register or re-register (a yearly requirement) with the City. No appointment necessary...you just show up, meet your neighbors and be patient.

Registration of a new pet with the City can be done at any time of the year. When it is time to reregister your pets (which should be done each year) then the city is asking you to do that in January and February. It is important that you register your pet even if it is not an outdoor animal. Pictures may be taken to be included with the registration description or just bring one of yours along. This helps our Animal Control Officers know who they are looking for if your pet was to get away from home. So, come, make your furry friend a legal resident of Windcrest!

Protecting Your Pipes from Freezing Temperatures

During below-freezing temperatures, San Antonio Water System reminds homeowners and businesses to be aware of the dangers of water pipes freezing or bursting in cold temperatures.



Here are tips from the American Water Works Association to help you avoid the cost and inconvenience of frozen pipes:

- **Disconnect and drain outdoor hoses** – Detaching the hose allows water to drain from the pipe so an overnight freeze doesn't burst the faucet or the pipe its connected to.
- **Insulate pipes or faucets in unheated areas** – It's best to wrap water pipes in unheated areas (such as the garage or crawl space) before temperatures plummet. You can find pipe wrapping materials at any hardware or building supply store.
- **Consider installing "heat tape" or "heat cable"** – Install "heat tape" or similar materials on all exposed water pipe (i.e. exterior pipe, or pipe located where the temperature might drop below freezing). It is relatively easy to install and can be found at your local hardware or building supply store. Be sure that you use only UL-listed products and follow the manufacturer's instructions carefully.
- **Seal off access doors, air vents, and cracks** – Winter winds whistling through overlooked openings can quickly freeze exposed water pipes. DO NOT plug air vents used by your furnace or water heater.
- **Find the master shutoff valve** – Usually located where the water line enters your house (or near the water heater or washing machine), the master shutoff valve turns off the water to the entire house. Paint it a bright color and make sure everyone in the household knows where it is.
- **What if it's too late?** – During an extended cold spell, your pipes can freeze, even if you take all the proper precautions. If you think you know where the freeze occurred and want to try thawing it yourself, the easiest tool to use is a hair dryer with a low heat setting. DO NOT under any circumstances use an open flame. Using the hair dryer, wave the warm air back and forth along the pipe. DO NOT heat only one spot on the pipe, as this can cause it to burst. If you don't have a hair dryer, you can wrap the frozen section with rags or towels and pour hot water over them. It's messy, but it works. Be careful when heating the pipe. It may already be broken and just not leaking because the water is frozen. When you thaw it out, the water could come gushing out. Be ready to run for the master shutoff valve if necessary.

Light Up






Light Up Entries
