Quality of Life is at the forefront of my platform. The City will improve the web site, newsletter, social media and other marketing materials so that everyone will know we live in the best city in Texas! We will continue to make upgrades to the pool, civic center, ball fields, parks, ponds, along with upgrading the common areas and re-landscaping medians where appropriate. I want to encourage homeowners to continue to fix up their homes and make improvements where warranted. That is why I will propose cutting permit fees for existing residences to just \$5. That is right, only \$5 for a permit. I want to encourage residents to put security alarms in their homes. One way to do this is waiving the yearly \$25 fee to register that you have an alarm. I will propose doing away with this fee.

I want to start a Fly the Flag program. I will ask that anyone who has a flagpole and flies the US flag to fly the Windcrest City flag underneath as well. I will encourage the City Council to provide a free Windcrest City Flag free of charge to any resident with a flagpole. I will also encourage businesses in Windcrest to do the same. Rackspace has already committed to doing so! People will see our pride!

Our roads and alleys will continue to be upgraded. I do not want to accept the use of chip seal street materials as an option regarding our residential streets. We deserve better.

I want everyone to know that we have the best police, fire, and first responder services in Texas. We have employees that will go the extra mile for the citizens they serve. However, with all that being said, there is still room for more improvement. We will address and do our due diligence with regard to the issue of speeding in our city by commuters who use our streets as thoroughfares or arterial roads to circumvent traffic as they pass through our community to their destination.

We will do all of this WITHOUT raising taxes!

There is plenty to do and the City needs your help. I invite ANY and EVERY citizen to get involved. NO CITIZEN will be turned away. I will make it a point to attempt to keep all citizens engaged and our government transparent, open, participatory and accountable. Commissions and Boards will be more empowered than ever before. First it was Back to Basics, then No More Business As Usual, and now our new slogan will be Team Windcrest. So please come in and visit myself or Mr. Castillo at City Hall or call me at 210-846-5507. Pam Dodson, a resident of Windcrest since 1997 was sworn in last Wednesday, May 18 as Mayor Pro Tem for the City of Windcrest. She joins new Mayor, Alan E. Baxter, re-elected councilperson, Rita Davis, recent addition to the Council Jim Shelton and new Council member John Gretz.

Pam and her husband moved here from Fort Sam Houston. "We looked all over the City of San Antonio but always came back to Windcrest. We wanted a place with good city services, such as fire and police. Windcrest has great access to downtown, the airport and now shopping at the Forum! It is an established community with wonderful shady oak trees and the people here take care of their homes."

Pam has seen a lot of changes over the years but one of the major changes that she felt was important and even spearheaded recently was a change to the Home Rule Charter. Home Rule Charter determines how local City government will operate and how much power residents will have. "I worked alongside a small group of Windcrest residents in order to come up with a Charter that gives more power to residents. For example, the right to recall now requires fewer signatures for a petition. Down from 800 to 400."

"If we can't get a small local government to work with its citizens on how their lives are governed what chance is there for larger counties, cities and states to be able to work with its citizens?" says Dodson.

Dodson says she is so excited to be working with new Mayor Alan E. Baxter. "He has so much energy and really thinks outside of the box! We have been through three elections together and share a vision for Windcrest and a desire for more community involvement and feedback. I respect his leadership and am very excited about the entire council that we have. I think they will all bring a new perspective and a lot more energy to the City of Windcrest. I'm proud to be a part of this group."







STAGE II WATERING RESTRICTIONS. When I wrote the article for the *Newsletter* last month, we were within a couple of days of going into Stage II. One day later, we received a nice rain. More important, the rains covered a large area of central Texas. As a result, the Edwards Aquifer rebounded about four feet. Unfortunately, no rain has fallen since then and the Aquifer has given up all the gains it made and then some. This morning (May 31st) the San Antonio Water System declared Stage II. We will, in all likelihood, follow within the week. The near term weather forecast is not favorable. No rain is expected in the immediate future, and the national forecast is the La Nina weather pattern is not expected to break down until the end of June, at the earliest. The pessimistic forecasters say it could last until October.



Please note that enforcement of the rules will be stepped up and citations will be issued for violation of the rules.

WATER MAIN BREAKS. Due to the higher temperatures and loss of ground moisture, we anticipate an increase in the number of main breaks as the ground adjusts to the changes. If you see an unusual amount of water where it shouldn't be, give us a call at 655-2888 or 422-4159 immediately. The sooner we can identify the source the better.

In Stage I, we had to reduce our average water use by 20%; in Stage II, an additional 10% reduction is mandated. To achieve that reduction, the watering restrictions are harsher.

Under Stage II, you can only water one day per week between the morning hours of 3:00 am and 8:00 am and evening hours of 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm on your scheduled day shown below.

0 and 1	Monday
2 and 3	Tuesday
4 and 5	Wednesday
6 and 7	Thursday
8 and 9	Friday

WATER STATISTICS FOR THE MONTH: The average household used approximately 12,830 gallons (17.14 ccf) of water during the April-May billing period. That's down slightly from March-April, but still a little above average for this time of the year. It is encouraging to note that the trend was down instead of up! If we can sustain that level, we should be alright.

RAINFALL: We received 1.02 inches of rainfall in May for a total of 4.79 inches in 2011. The lowest annual rainfall total for San Antonio was 13.7 inches in 1954. That was followed by two more years of exceptional drought.

The second change is a restriction on hand watering. Although you can still hand water any day, now you are only allowed to do so between 3:00 am and 8:00 am in the morning and 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm in the evening. You can water a vegetable garden and around your foundation any time. You can wash your vehicles only on your authorized watering day. We strongly recommend that you DO NOT lay new sod/turf grass as the watering restrictions cited above will not be waived. However, it can be hand watered in accordance with within the hours cited above. Activation of new irrigation systems is not permitted. Water can be added to pools, spas, and hot tubs to restore them to maintenance levels, but refilling of an empty pool or filling of a new pool is not permitted.

When Stage II is implemented, the decision will be widely publicized in the local papers and on the radio and television. If you don't read or hear about it from any other source, you will receive a notice from us in the mail announcing the decision. The flyer will include a detailed list of dos and don'ts. *The single most important thing you can do is to reduce the amount of water you put on your landscape (lawn, plants, shrubs, etc.).*
